# Configuration

LTI must be configured on both the LMS and Bodyswaps in order to connect.

**\*For Moodle Administrators Only**

# Step 1: Add Bodyswaps as a tool

- Log in as Admin into Moodle
- Navigate to *Site Administration* → *Plugins* → *Manage Tools* → *Configure a Tool Manually*
- Add a new *external tool* and fill tool configuration with the below.




# Step 1: Add Bodyswaps as a tool

Open up your Tool Configuration details, found under the burger menu of the tool.

- **Navigate to Bodyswaps Go.** *You must be an Admin and then you should then see an **Integrations Tab** on the left hand panel.*
- **Click CREATE** to open the new integration window

## Step 2: Register your LMS to Bodyswaps Go

- **Fill in the following details using your Tool configuration details on Moodle.**

Name	Description	Example

- **Switch on the ‘sync grades’ toggle if you would like grades to track in Moodle.**
- **Click SUBMIT**



## Step 3: Register our Public Key

- After clicking Submit, you'll be able to **Copy Public Key**.
- Copy and paste this back into the **PUBLIC KEY** field on Moodle.
  - Navigate to Site Administration → Plugins → Manage Tools
  - Find the Bodyswaps tool previously created
  - Click on the Cog icon in the top right hand corner of the tool
  - Paste the Copied PUBLIC KEY into the Public Key Section

\*Make sure to COPY/PASTE the ENTIRE Key beginning and ending with the dashes

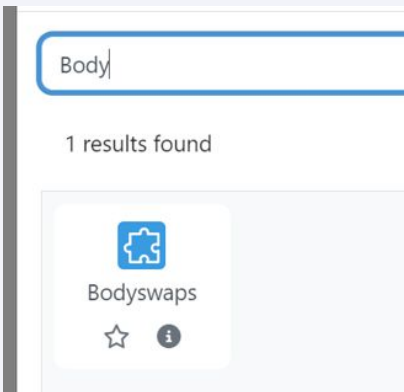
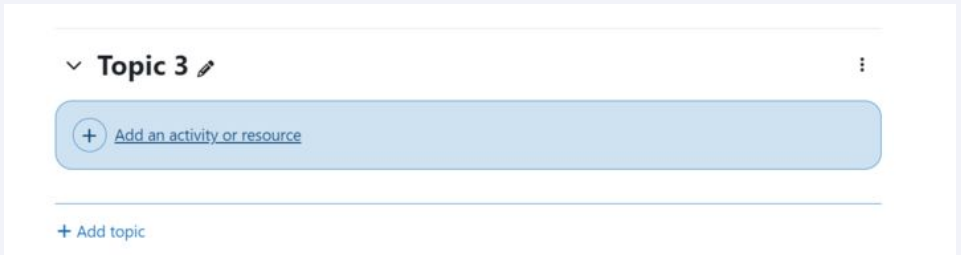

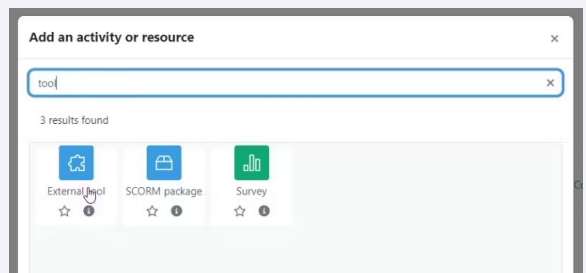

# Add a Bodyswaps activity to your course

- Go to your course in Moodle, add an activity or resource and search for Bodyswaps (or the name you have given your integration).
- Once inside the course, give the Activity a Name, then skip to page 14 of this document.



If you use a version of Moodle earlier than version 1.3, you'll need to add an External Tool when you click on 'Add an activity or resource' rather than search for the name of the tool.



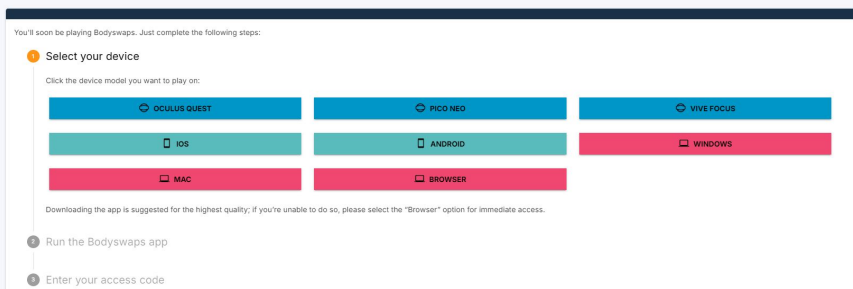

# How a Student Accesses the Assigned Bodyswaps Module(s)




- Once a student logs in, they will see the Bodyswaps activity inside their course
- Inside the activity, students will need to generate an ACCESS CODE to enter into the app by following the 3 steps.
  - Select your device
  - Run the Bodyswaps App
  - Enter your access code
- If you have browser streaming enabled on your Bodyswaps account, the student will be able to skip the code generation step above and play the module within their browser.



- If multiple modules have been set, a list of modules will appear and students can select which one they'd like to do and those they have already completed.
